Summer Open Water Scuba Camp FAQs



What is SCUBA Camp?

Scuba camp is a 5 day camp where kids ages 12-18yrs become certified PADI SCUBA ALBERTA TEXAS divers! Campers will receive their Junior Open Water or Open Water certification and National Geographic specialty. The Jr. Open Water certification allows divers to dive with either a certified parent, guardian or a dive professional. When the diver turns 15, they can upgrade to Open Water diver (no additional classes necessary to upgrade).

When is SCUBA Camp?

The Open Water Camp is July 7-11. Camp will start promptly at 8:30am each day of camp. Student pick up time is 5pm Monday—Wednesday and 4pm Thursday and Friday. Campers are responsible for their own transportation.

How many kids will be in the camp?

A maximum of 8-10 campers in each session.

How much does the SCUBA Camp cost?

Camp tuition is \$500. Full payment is required to reserve spot in camp.

What is included?

- PADI Open Water manual
- eRDP (dive tables)
- National Geographic materials
- Log books
- Rental DVD
- SCUBA equipment rental
- Entry into Windy Point Park and Aquarena Springs
- Aquarena Springs tour
- Certification cards
- Pizza party on Wednesday

What is needed for camp?

Swim suit, towel, sunscreen, lunch (except for Wednesday) and anything else your child may need during the day. Students will also need a wetsuit for Open Water dives (rental may be available). Students will also need their own snorkeling gear: mask, snorkel, fins, boots. Snorkeling gear is available at Scubaland and all students receive a student discount.

What do campers need to do before camp?

Read the Open Water manual, watch the DVD and finish all 5 knowledge reviews at the end of each chapter.

Complete all the paperwork and get a doctor's signature if they have a "yes" on the medical form.

Purchase their snorkeling gear or bring in their gear to check for fit.

_____The full non-refundable balance (\$500) is due to reserve your child's spot in the scuba camp

_____Students are responsible for providing their snorkeling gear: mask, snorkel, fins and boots

_____Students will need a wetsuit for any dives at Aquarena Springs. Scubaland has a limited selection of small rental wetsuits. The rental suits are available on a first come, first serve basis. If the student is not able to rent a wetsuit from Scubaland, they are responsible for providing their own (no shortys). Scubaland can order kids' wetsuits at a reasonable price. Let the staff know as soon as possible so they can get a suit on order.

_____ Scubaland will exchange any snorkeling gear that has been used only in the pool if the fit is not correct. Any returns will result in in-store credit only. No refunds.

_____For your child's safety and ours, Scubaland reserves the right to inspect your child's snorkeling gear before the orientation. Any equipment deemed unsafe, poor fit, or unsatisfactory will not be allowed to be used at scuba camp and will need to be replaced before camp begins. It is the student's and parents' responsibility to replace any gear before camp begins.

_____Scubaland will provide SCUBA gear: BCD, regulator, tanks, and weights

_____Students are responsible for picking up their Open Water Crew-pak, reading the Open Water Manual, watching the Open Water video (Scubaland will provide video rental) and completing all 5 Knowledge Reviews before camp begins.

_____The Medical form, Standard Safe Diving Practices, and Liability Release **MUST** be filled out and brought to the orientation

_____If the student has to answer "Yes" to any questions on the Medical form, the student **MUST** get a physician's (not a parent) signature on the Medical form saying the student is allowed to dive before the start of camp.

_____All students plus one parent/guardian are required to attend the orientation session. All forms must be completed by the orientation session and all students must have their snorkeling gear.

_____All students are responsible for their own transportation every day of camp.

_____Enrollment in scuba camp is not a guarantee in certification. All students must complete all Knowledge Reviews, and pass all quizzes and the final exam. Students are also required to swim 200yds, and tread water for 10 minutes. All students must also successfully complete all SCUBA skills in confined and open water. Scubaland and camp instructors will do everything they can to ensure success. If the requirements are not able to be completed during scuba camp, additional sessions may be necessary before a certification will be issued. An extra fee may be associated with the additional sessions.
